About the speaker: Dr. Rose earned her BS from The Ohio State University majoring in Evolution and Ecology with a minor in Natural Resource Management. She then earned a Ph.D. from The Ohio State University School of Environment and Natural Resources. Her dissertation research looked at the response of spider communities to disturbances. This included a small project at the Gwynne Conservation Area in coordination with the Wildland Fire class, looking at the spider community pre and post-prescribed burning. Dr. Rose's other projects looked at the impacts of a tornado, natural fire, and urbanization.

Dr. Rose is the author of the Princeton University Press Field Guide Spiders of North America, which was published last year. She currently is the chair of the American Arachnological Society Common Names Committee. She has accepted a position as a biology lecturer with The Ohio State University starting this fall.
